Oratorical Scholarship Program

A Constitutional Speech Contest

Open to all high school students The American Legion Oratorical Contest exists to develop deeper knowledge and appreciation for the U.S. Constitution among high school students. Since 1938, the program has presented participants with an academic speaking challenge that teaches important leadership qualities, the history of our nation's laws, the ability to think and speak clearly, and an understanding of the duties, responsibilities, rights and privileges of American citizenship. To date the National American Legion has awarded more than \$3,000,000 dollars to students who have participated in The American Legion High School Oratorical Scholarship Program.

Each year The American Legion Department (state) of Michigan holds and annual contest at the Gerald R. Ford Museum in Grand Rapids, Michigan. The winner of this contest moves on to the national level to compete for up to \$18,000 in scholarships.

Boys & Girls State June 14th - 20th 2020

Boys/Girls State is an educational program sponsored by the American Legion Departments across the country to help young men & women learn about government and how it works. Our motto is "Learn by Doing." The Boys/Girls State education staff 's goal is to facilitate the learning process by giving the



Boys/Girls State is LEARNING.

Delegates have the opportunity to learn more about their city, county, and state government in one week at Boys State than in an entire semester in a formal classroom setting. Boys/Girls Staters meet with elected and appointed officials to learn more about the duties and responsibilities of a variety of positions in government from people on the "inside." Additionally, in Boys/Girls State, each citizen has the opportunity to learn for himself that his government is just what he makes it.

Boys/Girls State is POLITICS.

The first half of your Boys/Girls State experience will expose you to the world of politics. You will nominate candidates for partisan and non-partisan offices on the city, county, and state level. You will also, no doubt, be exposed to the "seamy" side of politics ... the wheeling and dealing, the promises that cannot be kept, the vote trading and the cajoling, to give a candidate or a party that "extra advantage."

Boys/Girls State is GOVERNMENT.

When the dust has settled from the conventions, campaigns, and elections, Boys/Girls State needs to be governed for four days by its elected and appointed officials. Boys/Girls Staters will find themselves performing exactly the same functions as real office holders in the everyday world. Education and University Boards must make policies for their areas of responsibility. City councils, county commissions, and the state legislature must make ordinances and laws for their constituencies. Executive departments and other administrators must see that laws and policies are properly interpreted.

Boys/Girls State is FRIENDSHIP.

You may arrive at Boys/Girls State knowing no one else. However, one of the fringe benefits of Boys/Girls State is how easy it is to get to know people, many of whom may remain your friend for the rest of your life.

American Legion Legacy Scholarship

Do you know a child of a fallen 9/11 service member? OR

Do you know a child of aVA-rated, post 9/11 veteran with a combined disability rating of 50 percent of higher?

Since the inception of The American Legion Legacy Scholarship in 2001 following the Sept. 11 terrorist attacks, The American Legion has offered its support to the children of fallen post-9/11 service- members through this scholarship. Beginning with the 2017 award year, The American Legion expanded the scholarship to include children of VA-rated, post-9/11 veterans with a combined disability rating of 50 percent or higher. Our organization remains commit- ted to honoring the memory and service of our fallen and disabled comrades by ensuring their children are afforded the best possible educational opportunities.

Financial Aid Offered

The total amount of Legacy Scholarship money to be awarded varies based on the amount of donations received each year and the total amount of in- come derived from interest on the trust each year. Fifty percent of each amount is made available for awards each year – beginning with the 2017 award year. Each award made is good for one year and may be up to \$20,000. The amount of each award is determined by the financial need of that student as determined by fiscal information provided by the applicant during the application process. Depending on the amount of total money available for award, the number of applicants and the total need in a given year, all applicants might not receive an award. However, The American Legion will strive to offer as many awards as possible.
